



What can I do with a borrowed ebook from OverDrive?

- Share with others who have access to the card.
- Download in OverDrive Read (browser, Libby), EPUB (ADE, OverDrive App), PDF (ADE), or Kobo formats for personal use.
- Download on up to 6 devices with the OverDrive App or Adobe Digital Editions and as many devices as you would like with Libby (must use same card to sign in).
- Use for demonstrating and reading in class.
- Use in presentations, especially those titles that may have pictures or images, using the OverDrive Read format in browser.
- In some cases, printing and copying will be allowed and could be limited by number of pages per day.

What can I do with a borrowed audiobook from OverDrive?

- Share with others who have access to the card.
- Download in OverDrive Listen (browser, Libby), or MP3 (computer, OverDrive App) formats for personal use.
- Download on up to 6 devices with the OverDrive App or as many devices as you would like with Libby (must use same card to sign in).
- Use for demonstrations, read along with a book, or presentations.
- Burn to a CD/DVD, but this is dependent on publisher.
- Transfer to a device or Apple, but this is dependent on publisher.

What can I NOT do with a borrowed ebook from OverDrive?

- Depending upon publisher, copying of the title is not allowed.
- Depending on publisher, printing of the title is not allowed.
- Title cannot be given to another patron who does not have access to the library card that checked it out.
- Read at the same time as another user on the same card unless title is downloaded in EPUB to a specific device.
- PDF format cannot be opened on any mobile devices due to Adobe format lock. This can only be read on a computer.

What can I NOT do with a borrowed audiobook from OverDrive?

- File share the MP3 audiobook files.
- Title cannot be given to another patron who does not have access to the library card that checked it out.
- Listen at the same time as another user on the same card unless title is downloaded in MP3 to a specific device.
